III- Past Simple


The past simple tense is used:

- 1- To talk about things or actions happened and finished in the past.
 - e.g. Albert Rimes lived in the twentieth century.

He was a poet

He visited Luxor last week.

He wrote poetry.



- 2- To talk about a habit that took place in the past.
 - e.g. The Ancient Egyptians worshipped the sun.
- 3- It is used with "used to" to express a habit in the past.
 - **e.g.** In the past, people used to travel on horseback.
- 4- It is used with time expressions to refer to the past (last week, in the twentieth century, ten years ago...).
 - **e.g.** He died over ten years ago.

Note: The past simple of regular verbs if formed by adding **d** or **ed**. If the verb ends with a consonant preceded by a vowel the consonant is doubled.

```
e.g. travel --\rightarrow travelled, stop--\rightarrow stopped, equal --\rightarrow equalled (equaled US) rub--\rightarrow rubbed, hug --\rightarrow hugged.
```

With the exception of the verbs ending with 'lop'

e.g. developed \rightarrow

In one syllable words if the verbs ends in a consonant-vowel-consonant combination (CVC) double the final consonant and add "ed".

The same with the progressive form and adjectives to get the comparative form:

```
sit --→ sitting, run--→ running
```

bet, cut, dig, fit, get, hit, put, set, shut, ...

open -- > opened the last consonant is not doubled because the last syllable is not stressed
